Jesus tells a parable about his own second coming, emphasizing the need for readiness at all times.

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ¹"Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. ²Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ³When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; ⁴but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. ⁵As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. ⁶But at midnight there was a shout, `Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' ¬Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. ®The foolish said to the wise, `Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' ¹But the wise replied, `No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' ¹0And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came,

and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut.  $^{11}$ Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.'  $^{12}$ But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.'  $^{13}$ Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."
